Meanwhile... A Look Back over 46 Years as a Maxillofacial Prosthodontist... What was not Revealed

Abstract

A selected array of research in progress or completed but not published by myself or under my supervision of Prosthodontic graduate students over the last four + decades may offer some insight about matters directly or indirectly related to Maxillofacial Prosthetics. A brief summary overview of a smorgasbord of topics will be presented. Among the topics to be presented include, Oral Sensory change impact associated with radiotherapy for Head and Neck Cancer patients, Digital Subtraction radiography for single tooth implant treatments baseline vs. one-year post treatment, Photogrammetry as an alternative to conventional impression making or intra-oral scanning, machining tolerances of implant components, bite force measurement comparisons of CD/CD, CD/IOD, CD/ISP, Nat/Nat, and ISP/ISP. It is hoped that this presentation might offer some stimulus for others to pursue further investigation of the research presented and perhaps may offer guidance for those currently advancing research in their careers.

Biography

Jeffrey Rubenstein, Professor Emeritus and Immediate Past Director, Maxillofacial Prosthetic Service, University of Washington School of Dentistry. Credentials include, B.A. Rutgers College, D.M.D. Tufts University, G.P.R., Lancaster Cleft Palate Clinic and M.S. and Certificate in Prosthodontics (Maxillofacial), M.D. Anderson Hospital and the University of Texas. In 1983 he joined the Faculty at Harvard School of Dental Medicine's Department of Implant Dentistry. From 1989 -2021. He has been a full-time faculty member in the School of Dentistry at the University of Washington. Dr. Rubenstein is a Diplomate, American Board of Prosthodontics, Fellow of the American College of Prosthodontists and Academy of Prosthodontics, and active member of the Academy of Osseointegration. He is also a Fellow and Past President of the American Academy of Maxillofacial Prosthetics and the Washington State Society of Prosthodontists and a Fellow of the International Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Rehabilitation.
